



Area defined in the Canada-Nova Scotia Offshore Petroleum Resources Accord Implementation Act (c. 28, 21 July 1988, in force 22 December, 1989) as "the lands and submarine areas within the limits described in Schedule I."

References to a "Schedule" in the notes below are a reference to the Schedules in this Act. All quotations and definitions below are from this Act unless otherwise specified.

Section 5 of the Act authorized the Governor in Council to make regulations amending the description of the limits set out in Schedule I for the purpose of the definition of the "offshore area."

As noted Offshore Area above, other lines were defined using the North American Datum of 1983 (NAD 83).
